• Criminal Record Check & Vulnerable Sector (CRC-VS)

The Council requires you to submit a copy of a <u>criminal record check</u> "dated" within the past 36 months of submitting this application. PLEASE NOTE: If this is your first time submitting a criminal record check to us you will need to submit a c<u>riminal record check with vulnerable sector (CRC-VS)</u>. If you have previously submitted a CRC-VS you are only required to submit a criminal record check (CRC).
